Visa Documents

1. Europe Visa Document

Visa Application Form.

(In case of Minor) Both parents should sign application form & add a copy of passports.

A Birth certificate & minor identity card must be provided.

Valid passports with 2 blank pages.

Copy of previous Schengen visas, valid US & UK visas (If any)

2 Passport Size Photos (35*40)

Previous Passports is suggested to be bound together.

Original Visa Cover Letter.

(Letter must contain family name & relationship, a copy of covering letter mentioning travel plan with self introduction)

Relation Certificate and Marriage Certificate (Both Required)

Proof of Occupation

Self Employed – Cover letter on company letter head, company registration, partnership, proof of paid tax.

Employed – Work contract, letter from employer (no- objection) confirming leave period & returning back to work, copy of staff id.

Student – Letter from school / College confirming your studies, holiday or leave given to you, copy of Student ID.

Retired – Proof of Retirement / Pension book.

Proof of Accommodation

Hotel Booking

Confirmation of package tour & advance payment proof (if applicable)

Itinerary

Detailed day to day itinerary.

Evidence of Financial Status

Self-Employed: Last 6 months Personal and Business Bank Statements & Property Valuation.

Employed: Last 3 months Salary Slips / 3month salary bank statement, Personal Bank Statement 6 months & Property Valuation.

Student & Unemployed: Last 6 months Bank Statement of parents or legal guardian.

Retired: Personal pension bank statement for last 6 months. Proof of regular income generated by ownership of property or business & Property Valuation.

Schengen Travel Medical Insurance

Insurance minimum coverage of 30000 Euros.

Flight Reservation

Round Trip Flight Booking.

If applicable (Proof of Intra-Schengen flight, Train Itinerary or Car rental.)



Visa Application Fee
Pay by cash in Embassy.

Visa & Entry Requirements

Do Nepali citizens need a visa for Europe?

Yes. You'll need a Schengen Visa to visit most European countries.

Which countries are covered by the Schengen Visa?

26 countries including France, Germany, Italy, Spain, Switzerland, and more.

Where do I apply for the visa?

Through VFS Global (Thamel, Kathmandu). Choose the embassy of the country you'll spend the most time in.

How long does visa processing take?

Typically 3–9 working days, but apply at least 1 month in advance

Flights & Travel Tips

Which airlines fly from Nepal to Europe?

Qatar Airways, Turkish Airlines, Emirates, and others via Middle Eastern hubs.

Can I travel between countries freely?

Yes, once inside the Schengen Area, you can move between member countries without border checks.

Can I extend my tourist visa while in Europe?

No, tourist visas cannot be extended while traveling.

What currency is used?

Most countries use the Euro (€), but some (like Switzerland) use their own.

What should I pack?

Warm clothes (Europe can be chilly even in spring)

Power adapter (Europe uses Type C/E/F plugs)

Travel documents + copies

Snacks and Nepali essentials (masala, wai-wai if you miss home!)

Is travel insurance mandatory?

Yes, and it must cover medical emergencies up to €30,000

Do people speak English?

Yes, especially in tourist areas. But learning basic phrases in French, German, or Italian can be helpful.

Are Nepali foods available?

In major cities like London, Paris, and Berlin, yes! You'll find Nepali restaurants and South Asian groceries.





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
